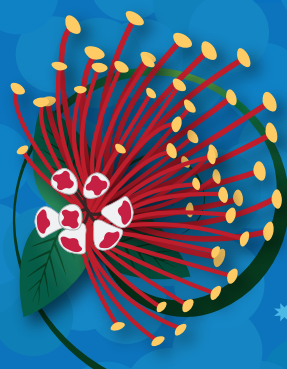

Matamata Piako Youth Ambassador Awards 2017 Ngā mihi nui ki a koe Makoha

Makoha Nightingale-Pene is the first recipient of the Ngāti Hauā 'Contribution to Maori' Award received on 3 December 2017 at the inaugural Matamata Piako Youth Ambassadors Awards held at the Kaimai Cheese Factory in Waharoa.

Makoha Nightingale-Pene is of Ngāti Hauā, Ngāti Werewere descent, he affiliates to Rukumoana Marae and is currently employed at Ngāti Hauā Mahi Trust while completing a Bachelor of Arts in Te Reo and Tikanga. He is also a member and tutor of Te Kāheru Matarau a Hauā and helps as a kapahaka tutor at Morrinsville College.

On December 5, Makoha began an intership with the The National Institute of Water and Atmospheric Research Ltd (NIWA). Makoha will be spending the next three months working with the aquaculture team on projects within the Ngāti Hauā rohe particularly the Piako catchment.

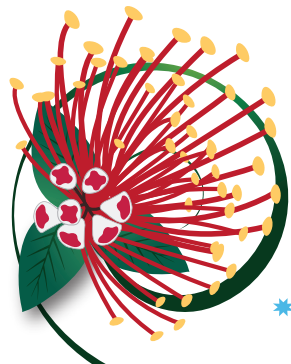

Tōnui Reo, Tōnui Tangata

Tēnā tātou katoa

Kua hora te kahu wera o Hine-raumati, pūāwai mai ana ngā rau o te pōhutukawa. Ko tōna rite, ko te pūāwaitanga o tā tātou kaupapa mō te reo o Ngāti Hauā. He hua nō te rau ringaringa, he pua nō te rau aroha. Tēnā uhia mai ō kanohi ki te rau o te aroha!

In October of this year, Ngāti Hauā Iwi Trust was proud to host its first-ever Te Reo symposium 'Kōkōia, e ara' at Te Wharekura o Te Rau Aroha. Over 250 people attended the symposium, which focussed on building knowledge of Te Reo in key areas such as whaikōrero, karanga, and mōteatea. Surveys and discussions were also conducted at the symposium, to gather your ideas for a long-term Te Reo strategy for Ngāti Hauā.

The information gathered has been compiled into a report titled 'Tonui Reo, Tōnui Tangata: A Flourishing Language, A Flourishing People'. Towards a long-term Te Reo revitalisation approach for Ngāti Hauā. A copy of this report can be found on our website <http://ngatihauaiwitrust.co.nz/report-te-reo-o-ngati-haua/>

The purpose of the report is to help Ngāti Hauā Iwi Trust, in conjunction with Te Ohu Reo o Ngāti Hauā, to develop a draft strategy in readiness for the Ngāti Hauā hui-ā-iwi in February 2018. Once completed, the strategy will be used to guide the Te Reo revitalisation efforts of the Trust in the long-term.



Te Pae Hihiri

In September this year, marae trustee elections were held for three of our marae Rukumoana, Te Iti o Hauā and Waimakariri.

Mitchell Rakatau was re-elected by Rukumoana Marae as was Linda Raupita by Waimakariri Marae. Raylene Walters was elected by Te Iti o Hauā Marae.

We welcome Raylene to the Board and acknowledge Te Pora Thompson-Evans and Adam Whauwhau (former Trustees) for Te Iti o Hauā Marae.

At the completion of the round of marae elections, the full Board undertook a governance training programme specifically tailored for iwi organisations delivered by the Institute of Directors in partnership with Te Puni Kokiri.
